# <u>PSAT's</u>

The 2019 Preliminary Scholastic Assessment Test/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT) will be administered during the school day on Wednesday, October 16th to all 9<sup>th</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup>, and 11<sup>th</sup> grade students. The test will begin promptly at 7:25am and is free of charge. The test is co-sponsored by the College Board and National Merit Scholarship Corporation and is an important step in making college plans. All 12<sup>th</sup> grade students will be required to arrive at school for the senior group picture at 11:00am. A regular class schedule will begin at 11:05 with periods 4 (lunch), Period 1, and Period 2 classes meeting during the remainder of the day.

The SHS Guidance Department will host a College Fair on Thursday, October 24th from 12:50 PM – 2:00 PM in the gymnasium. The ACES High team faced every match competitively and overall finished the qualifying matches in second place! In the championship round, our alliance faced some stiff competition. Even though we did not win the overall competition, we performed very well and proved that the SHS/WLHS was a team to be reckoned with. ## Fall Drama Production-December 5, 6 & 7<sup>th</sup>

This fall, the Suffield High School drama program is taking on an exciting challenge: mounting an original musical production, *BFF*, which revolves around a network of high school friends and whose drama is driven by issues and struggles that people of all ages face today. It's about friendship, social pressures, truth and lies, settling scores, digital media, manipulation, and much more. This also includes falling in love — taking a leap of faith and trust in today's perilous times. *BFF* is a production that has been described as featuring "a beautifully melodic score, pointed and poignant lyrics, contemporary dialogue, action, intense drama and comedic moments, and more," and it will be highlighting dozens of our talented actors, singers, and dancers from Suffield High School.

The drama of *BFF* is driven by a complexly evolving bullying story that draws in several groups of friends and poses tough questions about how we treat others, face crises together, and can find the strength to face the anxieties and conflicts that are so common in our times. The rise of issues related to power, gender identity, coercion, and relationship violence make the central themes of *BFF* forcefully relevant to our cast and production team. The play features a core of strong female characters and a lead who takes dramatic action — akin to a DIY superhero — to right wrongs she sees taking place around her. The show is energized by contemporary songs that range from feet pumping dance numbers to touching ballads to dramatic musical numbers, including such titles as "Beacon," "Sup," "Bully Fighter Forever," "I'm Not Interested," "A Real Sunset," "Your New Best Friend," "What Do They Want?" and "You and Me and We."

There are many exciting cutting-edge approaches to the staging of the play that reflect the role of social media in our lives, from the use of projected images and texts to multiple settings across the stage linked through digital communication. Numerous staff members from various departments are working together collaboratively to produce this work under the leadership of director Carl Casinghino, technical director Joe Grimard, and music director Josh Karam (an alumnus of SHS and recent grad of Hartt's music theatre program). The production will have its premiere run on December 5, 6, and 7 of this year (Thursday through Saturday shows).
